

Selectmen's Meeting
April 6, 2009
4:00 P.M.

A Meeting of the Board was held on the above date in the Fred B. Morgan Jr. Meeting Room, Town Hall. Members present were Arthur Smadbeck, Chairman, Michael J. Donaroma and Margaret E. Serpa. Town Administrator Pamela M. Dolby was present.

Nancy Kelly, Habitat for Humanity, came before the Board to discuss a proposal to have a Designer Showhouse in the Kenniston House on Main Street. Business would decorate the rooms, they would sell tickets for tours, they would have a small shop for items, and they are discussing a tent to be erected in the back yard which would be leased for cocktail parties. They also requested a 15 minute drop off spot in front of the house, that request was dropped.

Ms. Dolby asked for the week to look into this and get back to the Board. She felt it may need to go to the Zoning Board.

It will be placed on next weeks agenda for final action.

A Weekday Amusement license was granted to Atria.


Minutes for February 2, 2009, March 9, 2009, March 16, 2009 and, March 30, 2009 were approved.
