Conservation Agent: Submitted by Jane Varkonda:

The Commission had one meeting in February.

February 12, 2020: Meeting with TTOR update Katama Farm use plan and livestock update.; Aldeborgh: construct dwelling and septic; Sargent-demo existing, rebuild; 79 Turkeyland Cove-addition to boathouse enlarge patio; Alexander-dredge inlet at Eel Pond; Oyster Watcha Trust-renovations, reconfigure parking, entry ways, build pool; KJC Realty Trust-replace wooden bulkhead with revetment; Majors Cove-amend Order to stend Order and amend height for vegetation/view channel. Katama Nominee Trust-approve minor changes in footprint; Swartz-appeal of Enforcement Order request for hearing; MV Museum-executive session.

The Commissions work load continues steady with some glitches in work load due to vacations in February for both staff members. Site inspections were limited to ongoing projects such as the revetment work at Fuller St. Beach for a private residence and an addition of sand snow fence and beach grass at Fuller St. Beach. We assisted the County and Mass DOT to nourish the area near the Big Bridge which was undermining the bike

path. That area has also been planted with beach grass with cooperation and manpower from the contractors who did beach grass planting at Fuller Street Beach.

The Conservation Commission sent a letter to TTOR re: the efforts needed to take a more proactive approach on management of natural resources of Norton Point, especially the entrance to the beach at the Left Fork. The town has been urging TTOR for two years to take measures to improve the resiliency of the particular stretch of the beach for many reasons including, but not limited to filling in of the Herring Creek when the beach washes over during high tide cycles.

The Commission will be assisting the Park Dept in planning and permitting moving infrastructure at South Beach. Our immediate focus without further erosion occurring between now and the fall will be moving the bathhouse structure at the left fork, and restoring a dune in that location to help protect the resiliency of Katama Road and Atlantic Ave. We have reached out to the Dredge Dept and they are confident next seasons dredging jobs will provide enough sand for our needs.

The Commissions Agent is working with our Consultants at The Woods Hole Group to complete our Town wide infrastructure resiliency assessment for the State MVP program grant. Our intent is to apply for some action grant funds for projects such as moving the bath structure at Left Fork dune.

We have done preplanning with representatives of regulatory agencies including Mass DEP and Coastal Zone Management.

Council on Aging: Submitted by Greg Rollins:

The Anchors, Edgartown Council on Aging, provided programs and delivered services to 233 seniors, 593 times in February 2020. These included, *but were not limited to*, the following events and assistance:

- 24 seniors attended art, needle point, and artist of the month presentation a combined total of 67 times
- 22 seniors attended fitness and exercise classes a total of 59 times

- 9 seniors played mah jong 37 times

- 74 seniors received advocacy and case management 105 times
- 107 seniors received general information 145 times
- 4 seniors attended memory support group 18 times

- 16 seniors received 21 "are you okay" phone calls
- 4 seniors received mental health support 6 times

VOLUNTEER STATISTICS

Seniors donated 67.05 hours of their time to various clubs and programming including, but not limited to, 16 hours assisting with cooking and prepping Anchors' lunches; 17 hours managing our Mah Jong Club and games and 8 hours of administrative support and receptionist duties

In addition to the above, our public town nurse appeared at the Anchors to do health and blood pressure screenings for all who requested it. Our ear and hearing wellness licensed hearing specialist performed hearing tests, hearing aid checks, and general checkups at no cost. Our SHINE ("Serving Health Insurance Needs for Everyone") counselor advised on Medicare and Medicaid weekly.

Energy Committee: Submitted by Alan Strahler:

- At a public meeting on February 4, Committee Chair Alan Strahler presented a statement supporting the placement of inductive chargers for VTA buses on Church Street. The statement was devised and adopted by the Energy Committee at its meeting on January 29th.
- Alan Strahler attended the Cape Light Compact Board meeting on February 13 as the Edgartown representative.
- On February 18, the Energy Committee briefed the Selectmen on progress toward Green Community Status. The Selectmen endorsed the Committee's ongoing efforts, including approvals of (1) an energy audit of Town buildings to be conducted by Rise Engineering in March; (2) placing of the Stretch Code bylaw on the Town Warrant for approval by town voters; and (3) approval of a possible public hearing or public meeting on the Stretch Code.
- At the Committee's request, James Hagerty applied to Eversource for the placement of an electric power supply to support the electric car chargers for the town requested on the Town Warrant. Most likely site for the chargers is the Triangle Park and Ride. A site visit by Eversource is anticipated for March.
- The Energy Committee met on February 19.
- Committee member Kat Monterosso was designated as the Committee's representative for the proposed Town Master Plan effort.
- The Committee scheduled two informational meetings at the Edgartown Library about its warrant articles -- 100% renewable energy by 2040 (March 24, 4 PM, Edgartown Library) and Stretch Code (March 31, 4 PM, Edgartown Library.
- The Committee, in collaboration with Margaret Song of Cape Light Compact, completed the Town's energy baseline for FY2018 and FY2019 as of February 23.

The mild winter weather continues to be helpful as contractors work within the district making for a busy February in the village. The exterior of the Yellow House is fast coming together and the long abandoned corner is displaying the lovely renovation of an iconic downtown building.

The HDC met on February 6th & 20th. The Commissioners discussed and approved 9 applications. In addition, Mr. Finn from the Planning Board, reviewed possible changes to the Edgartown Zoning bylaw on February 6th and there was a presentation, by Edgartown resident, Ms. Chittick, regarding the HDC bylaw and her concerns relating to the Vineyard Transit Authority's approval for changes to the public spaces at the busy bus location.

Applications were heard and approved at 41 Main St. for removal of a 2nd floor door, 52 S. Summer St. for addition of a generator enclosure, 80 S. Water St. for a change to a previously approved plan and the addition of a chimney, 38 Morse St. for a change to an approved plan adding windows, 18 Starbuck Neck for the addition of an outdoor kitchen, 3 Mill St. for new windows, 1 Morse St. for a temporary approval of a fuel storage tank, 20 School St. for fencing, 34 S. Summer St. doors and windows. In addition there were 7 administrative approvals for repairs to siding and replacement roofing.
