Conservation Agent: Submitted by Jane Varkonda:

The Commission held two public meetings in September 9/11 and 9/25 and a meeting in Executive Session.

- September 11, 2019: Vought: guesthouse, septic upgrade; Sheriff's Meadow: trail relocation & expansion of wet meadow; Swartz; Town of Edgartown; Sullivan 32 Ocean View Ave – update; Horvitz – update on turn around at Fuller Street; Dekker – update landscaping issues; Executive session.
- September 25, 2019: AKACMV: pool, pool house; Regan: additions to dwelling; Vought: additions and ongoing landscaping/lighting issues; Town of Edgartown: Katama boat ramp rebuild; Sheriff's Meadow; Dekker: Pinney; Waller farm: request for hoop houses; Suhler – update lack of buffer/Cert Compliance issue; Horvitz: result of survey; MVC checklist revisions; Open Space plan questionnaire.



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Work load is slowing down with the end of summer, but is still voluminous and steady. Commission staff members regularly meet with applicants and their contractors on site and in the office to review plans and address issues that arise. In addition to answering questions and emails from the public in the office, via phone calls or emails as well as review and prepare agent reports for the Commissioners.

- Prepared and coordinated with Town Counsel for settlement with Mass DEP regarding hearing with DEP prior to trial on the case.
- Coordinate and attend meeting for Norton land project
- Coordinate and consult with consultants for MEPA and MESA filings; attend site visits with rare species consultant for habitat assessments for Norton land project.
- Attend and coordinate logistics for Katama airfield burn.
- Attend kick off meeting for MVP Infrastructure assessment meeting.
- Prepare and submit monthly reports to State re: MVP action grant; Prepare for submission of MVP Action grant for beach management plan.
- Attend Dredge and Airfield meetings.

Property management:

- Regular site visit to Katama farm including, but not limited to lease compliance; Aero Ave maintenance; regular communications with TTOR staff re: issues and event and compliance with lease.
- Fisherman's Landing: end of season wrap up and grading and mowing coordination with highway dept.
- Katama Airfield: regular site visits to inspection for compliance with leases and property regulations. Coordinate with TNC, burn crew and EPD re Katama burn. Coordinate with TNC re: rare species monitoring, invasive species control and habitat management grant from Fisheries and Wildlife. Assemble members for Katama airfield stewardship committee.
- South Beach and Norton Point: work with Woods Hole Group on MVP action grant for Beach management Plan; coordinate with TTOR on management plan and trail relocation.

Council on Aging: Submitted by Paul Mohair:

The Anchors, Edgartown Council on Aging, provided programs and delivered services to 298 seniors, 917 times in September, 2019. These included, but were not limited to, the following events and assistance:

PROGRAMS AND EVENTS

- 23 seniors attended art, needle point, and artist of the month presentation a combined total of 53 times
- 20 seniors attended fitness and exercise classes a total of 40 times
- 120 seniors attended recreational and social activities, including 119 seniors who attended 168 lunches; 22 seniors who played bridge 41 times



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- 19 seniors played mah jong 69 times
- 28 seniors took our Friends-subsidized Anchors trip to the North End in Boston

SERVICES AND OUTREACH

- 25 seniors received advocacy and case management 38 times
- 83 seniors received general information 125 times
- 8 seniors attended memory support group 20 times
- 28 seniors received 37 phone consultations
- 20 seniors received “are you safe” storm calls
- 9 seniors received mental health support 21 times

VOLUNTEER STATISTICS

- 15 seniors donated 116 hours of their time to various clubs and programming including, but limited to, 25 hours assisting with cooking and prepping Anchors’ lunches; 18 hours managing our Mah Jong Club and games; 22 hours of administrative support and receptionist duties.

In addition to the above, our public town nurse appeared at the Anchors to do health and blood pressure screenings for all who requested it. Our ear and hearing wellness licensed hearing specialist performed hearing tests, hearing aid checks, and general checkups at no cost. Our SHINE (“Serving Health Insurance Needs for Everyone”) counselor advised on Medicare and Medicaid weekly. A local artist, Teresa Yuan, displayed her paintings throughout the Anchors.

Historic District: Submitted by Brique Garber:

The HDC met on Sept 5th & 19th. These meetings addressed 2 Public Hearings as well as a list of minor construction applications. Public Hearings were held for renovations to the Edgartown Inn and an addition to the house at 41 Winter St. Both Public Hearings were well attended and resulted in approval from the Commission

Applications were heard and approved for: shutters at 56 Cottage, minor changes to the approved Yellow House renovations, changes to approved plans at 8 Pierce Lane and 8 Peases Pt. Way S., the addition of a fence at 87 Pease's Point Way North and the demolition and rebuild of a garage at 62 S. Summer.

Additionally, the members viewed plans submitted by the Vineyard Transit Authority for renovations to the Visitor Center waiting areas, renovations and additions to the home at 82 N. Water and renovations to the house at 88 S. Water and the addition of detached bedrooms. These applications were sent forward for Public Hearings in October and November.

The Planning Board met twice in September.

Actions included:



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- SP (Coastal District) to construct an addition to an existing non-conforming dwelling on Dairy Way
- ANR: division of one parcel into three lots on Turkeyland Cove Road
- SP (Coastal District) for a minor addition to dwelling in shore zone on Chappaquiddick Road
- SP (Coastal District) for a guest house in the inland zone on Jane's Cove Road.
- SP (Coastal District) for a swimming pool in the inland zone on Bayside South
- Request for a Repetitive Petition related to a SP application previously denied by the Planning Board
- SP (Coastal District) for a two-car garage on Ocean View Avenue

The Planning Board also conducted deliberation in regard to:

- Concerns about Summer Construction in Downtown Edgartown
- Concerns about traffic speed and volume on Chase and Pinehurst Roads
- A proposal to adjust the roadway and Shared Use Path ("SUP") on Edgartown / Vineyard Haven Road

The Planning Board appointed Mr. Fred Mascolo to serve as its representative to the Short Term Rental Advisory Committee.

Upcoming Business includes:

- An ongoing review of the DRI Checklist revision #14, as drafted by the MV Commission, with recommendations to the Commission to be submitted to the Commission prior to November 1.
- Organization and participation in an All-Island Planning Boards meeting, to be held on October 22, 2019, in West Tisbury.
- Hosting a public hearing (tentatively scheduled for November 12, 2019) related to proposed improvements to Edgartown / West Tisbury Road as mentioned above.
- Hosting a public hearing (likely in December) related to potential changes to the Zoning Bylaw, addressing concerns related to minor habitable structures on residential lots, and other minor zoning bylaw changes.

Other Business:

- The Board approved submission of a CPC grant application related to a proposal to create a pedestrian and bicycle path along a portion of the Swimming Place Path ancient way, between Herring Creek Road and Road to the Plains.

And, as always, the Planning Board welcomes input from Town boards, committees and residents on all matters.

Chief Operators Report September 2019

Flow for Sept. 2019 was 10,137,225 gal.

Flow for August 2019 was 15,721,614 gal.

September Septage was 257,802 gal.

Total Nitrogen was 2.79 mg/L and 1.81 mg/L for a monthly average of 2.3 mg/L reported to DEP.

- Tue. 9/3/19; Hurricane Dorian tracking to pass 160 mi. SE of Nantucket. Site visit with Megan Ambrose of UConn/Storrs. Plant is nearly identical to ours, has undergone considerable capital upgrades.
- Wed 9/4; Emergency Preparedness meeting with Dept. heads. BS51 main compressor motor fail. Punch list and storm preparedness briefing for staff.
- Thur 9/5; Site and downtown MH prep for possible hurricane. Dorian downgraded but project 30-50 mph wind with higher gusts.
- Fri. 9/6; Dorian tracking east. No storm surge projected.
- Mon. 9/9; conference call with Water and Highway on Church St. VTA project.
- Wed. 9/11; Small Communities specialty conference at Save the Bay in Providence RI.
- Mon. 9/16; Pinch valve installed in Septage by operators, including input/output wiring. Operates perfectly. Blocked line at Llewellyn Way-unused section from 2010 in cul-de-sac filled with debris. Exactly why minimum flow requirements are needed.
- Tue. 9/17; Williamson quote on Chase impellers \$13K per pump. Not feasible. Interview and filming with E-One on pump program and nitrogen mitigation plan.
- Thur. 9/19; Site visit with T&B on next round of CIP projects, the large ones. Notice from Duarte Cir. trust on participation of all abutters. Draft submittals for Chase, Dunham, Septage, SCADA, sludge cake pump and polymer feed replacements.
- Fri. 9/20; Site visit from RBO for scum pump replacement.
- Mon. 9/23; Vulnerability Assessment meeting with Dept. heads. Church St./VTA site plans. Great Pond Foundation request for 15 years of monitoring well results in the watershed, customer list and sewer participation.
- Wed. 9/25; Change order for ITS to upgrade Chase PLC-moved project back to October.

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Water Department: Submitted by William Chapman:

Operational Report September 2019

- Routine mowing of all facilities was completed to maintain appearance and vegetation control.
- Residents initiated the process to add a fire hydrant at the end of Hamblin Way (private road). The Water Department will provide the materials at our cost and oversee the installation. This is a new concept for the department that we hope will continue, as the Fire Department, residents and the Water Department all stand to benefit from additional fire protection.
- Lead and copper sample results for the distribution system were received, with very favorable results. The Action Level for lead is 0.015 mg/L and our highest reading was 0.0079 mg/L. The Action Level for copper is 1.3 mg/L. Our highest detect was 0.329 mg/L. Further, per the 90th% rule, our reportable lead was 0.0032 mg/L and copper was 0.271 mg/L.
- The damage to Quenomica Pumping station as the result of a faulty air release valve has been repaired by Water Department personnel. No insurance claim was necessary.
- Final paving was completed on several sites that required asphalt removal for distribution system repairs and water service installations.
- The Water Department extended the 8 inch main on 18th Street South. There is now roughly 200 feet left to complete the loop.

- 27-2019 WHIPPLE– 82 NORTH SUMMER ST (Assr. Pcl. 20D-91) a request for a special permit under 10.1 g and 10.3 d 3 to renovate and construct additions to an existing single-family dwelling – including an accessory apartment and a swimming pool was withdrawn at the public hearing.
- 28-2019 EDGARTOWN INN REALTY TRUST– 56 NORTH WATER STREET (Assr. Pcl. 20d-226) a request for a special permit under sections 2.3 B 3 & 10.1 G 2 to allow the demolition of a preexisting, nonconforming structure and its rebuilding on substantially the same footprint was approved.
- 29-2019 LOOMIS – 93 SCHOOL STREET (Assr. Pcl. 29A-4.1) a special permit under section 10.1 G to allow the renovation, relocation, and addition to an existing structure and the construction of a carriage house with detached bedroom above on a preexisting, nonconforming lot was granted with a condition.
- 30-2019 38 GREAT PLAINS WAY – 1 GARDEN COVE ROAD (Assr. Pcl. 44-52) a special permit under section 10.1 G to allow the construction of a swimming pool, pergola, and equipment shed on a preexisting, nonconforming lot was granted.
- 31-2019 BERGER d.b.a. IMPRIMIS LLC – 31 NORTH SUMMER STREET (Assr. Pcl. 20D-347.12) a modification to a previous special permit to allow minor additions to the exterior and interior reconfiguration was approved with a condition.
- 32-2019 PERKINS – 31 OLD DUNHAMS CORNER WAY (Assr. Pcl. 37-156.36) a special permit to allow the construction of a two-bay garage with storage above on a preexisting, nonconforming lot was granted under section 10.1 G.
