DECISION OF THE ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS ON THE REQUEST FOR A SPECIAL PERMIT

Owner/Applicant: Edmund Cottle III

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At a meeting held remotely via Zoom on Wednesday, 16 December 2020, the Edgartown Zoning Board of Appeals voted unanimously (5-0) to grant a special permit under section 10.1 G of the zoning bylaw to allow the construction of a replacement dwelling on a nonconforming lot located at 17 Tenth Street North, Assr. Pcl. 11B-1.21, (formerly 18 Pilgrim Road) as shown on to the site plan dated 24 September 2020 by Vineyard Land Surveying, and on the floor plans and elevations dated 1 September 2020 by HG Design Group LLC.

FINDINGS:

- 1. The board finds that the proposal conforms to all setbacks and height restrictions.
- 2. The board finds the proposal to be compatible with the scale of the neighborhood and the site adequate in area for the proposed construction.
- 3. There was no opposition to the project from town boards or departments.
- 4. As there will only be parking on the property for two cars, the board finds that the project is unlikely to significantly increase traffic on 10th Street, which in addition is not a through-street.
- 5. The board finds that the project will benefit the neighborhood by replacing a derelict property with a new single family residence.

CONDITIONS:

No additional conditions were proposed.
