The Commission held two public meetings in December.

The volume of office and field work slowed down slightly as per usual during the holidays, but the turnover in the real estate market has kept this department, and others, busier than usual. It is noted that the usual end of the year conservation restrictions and easements has decreased over the years as property owners find other methods to take advantage of tax incentives. The Agent continues to work with the Dredge Advisory Committee and the Fisherman's Landing Stewardship Committee on various projects. The work at South Beach and Norton Point to move a bathhouse landward and reconstruct dunes was started requiring a lot of time in the field to monitor the progress and make adjustments as needed. Kara Shemeth started her position as Conservation Assistant, replacing Lisa Morrison who retired in October.

December 2021 was a busy month at the Anchors. We hosted our regular programming, including our Tuesday brown bag lunches and Friday Cafe To Go, and our Director of Senior Services, Meris Keating, introduced some new seasonal crafting workshops which were a big hit. We hosted a scaled down version of our Annual Open House during Christmas in Edgartown celebrations, and we shared holiday cookies and the popular 2022 day planners with Edgartown residents who stopped by to say hello.



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We welcomed the assistance of volunteers to deliver Elder Services of the Cape and Islands' holiday meals on Christmas Day. We reached out to our Town's older residents in advance of winter storms to help get them any assistance they might need.

We worked with Edgartown Fire Department and EMTs to begin the distribution of the gift bags that they compiled to give Edgartown's older adults. Outreach Worker Victoria Haeselbarth helped people with referrals to support services as well as trying to navigate the Covid-19 booster- and testing process.

Throughout the month of December, we kept abreast of the growing impact of Covid-19 on our community, and we made the difficult decision to suspend in-house programming beginning December 27th. Since that date, we've continued to provide fresh, to-go meals two days a week and regular deliveries to our homebound neighbors. We're still helping people via phone, email, and one-on-one visits in the COA when possible. We hope to return to our regular programming schedule as the Covid-19 data improves.

### **Energy Committee: Submitted by Alan Strahler:**

- On December 1, Eversource provided a revised plan to the Town for bringing power to the designated parking spaces in the Park and Ride lot for two dual-port electric vehicle chargers. In subsequent communications, a start date of January 3, 2022, was confirmed for their work.
- Also on December 1, Committee Chair Alan Strahler attended an initial all-hands virtual meeting of all committees of the MVC Climate Action Plan. He was joined by Committee Member Kat Monterosso.
- On December 6 and December 20, Kat and Energy Committee Member Jack Ensor attended virtual meetings of the Town's Master Plan Steering Committee as members of that committee. Alan also attended as an observer.
- Alan attended a virtual meeting of the Cape and Vineyard Electric Cooperative as the board member representing Edgartown on December 8. He also attended a virtual meeting of the Energy Transformation Thematic Group of the Climate Action Plan on the same date.
- The Energy Committee met on December 9 and discussed the possible formation of a Town Climate Committee. The Committee reviewed a draft of a letter to be presented to the Selectboard requesting the formation of the committee and adopted the letter by unanimous vote. The committee also reviewed the progress of the project to provide Level-2 electric vehicle chargers at the Park and Ride lot, as well as the pending status of the Town's application for a grant to cover the cost of a direct-current fast charger. The committee decided by consensus to request Town funding for such a charger, which would be needed in the event that the grant was declined.
- Other discussions at the Committee's December 9 meeting included the contents of the committee page on the Town web site; the Committee's energy questionnaire for town residents; liaison with the MVC Climate Action Plan; and liaison with the Town's Master Plan Steering Committee. Ongoing projects discussed were energy savings measures for Town buildings, the status of the application for the Town to join the Green Community program, and the RFP process for a lease of the closed landfill on Meshacket Road for development of a solar energy facility.



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- Alan and Jack attended question and answer sessions with two of the firms bidding for the lease of the Town Landfill on December 9, as members of the Town's RFP Evaluation Committee.
- At its December 13 meeting, Alan presented the letter from the Energy Committee to the Selectboard requesting the formation of a Town Climate Committee and the Selectboard approved. Town Administrator James Hagerty subsequently released a press release regarding the Committee's formation and urging interested town residents to apply to the Selectboard by January 7. A legal notice of the search for committee members appeared in the Vineyard Gazette on December 17.
- On December 27, Alan accompanied Alex Dwyer of Rise Engineering and a Rise lighting specialist to resurvey lighting conversion to low-energy LED tubes at the Edgartown School.
