We look forward to working with the VTA and HAMV to get the van on the road and begin serving Edgartown's older adults with another transportation support.

Energy Committee: Submitted by Alan Strahler:

- On January 4, Committee Chair Alan Strahler attended a meeting of the Planning Board at their request to discuss the Climate Committee authorized by the Selectboard on December 13.
- The Energy Committee met on January 6. Discussions included (1) status of applications for the new town Climate Committee; (2) the Commonwealth's Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) program for energy efficiency loans and its utility for Edgartown; (3) additional items and links for the committee's town website page; (4) status of the Green Community application and of its Energy Reduction Plan and Fuel Efficient Vehicle Policy; (5) status of installation of Level-2 chargers at the Town Park and Ride lot; (6) status of a warrant article for the 2022 Town Meeting submitted for funding for a direct-current fast charger for electric vehicles.
- Alan attended a virtual meeting of the Cape Light Compact as the board member representing Edgartown on January 12.
- On January 14, Alan and Committee Member Jack Ensor attended a meeting of the Town's evaluation committee for final evaluation of the RFPs received for the leasing of the Meshacket closed landfill.
- Also on January 14, the committee noted the completion of the building of the site for vehicle chargers at the Park and Ride including installation of the chargers. Operation awaited connection of the site to Eversource power.
- On January 18, Alan met with the Vineyard Power Development Fund Advisory Committee as the Edgartown representative. The committee will advise Vineyard Power on distributions from three development funds provided by Community Benefit Agreements between Vineyard Power and Vineyard Wind, Park City Wind, and Commonwealth Wind projects, acting on behalf of all island towns.
- At an FY2023 budget hearing of the Financial Advisory Committee and the Selectboard on January 26, Alan defended the Energy Committee's request for funding from Free Cash to purchase a direct-current fast charger for vehicles. Following discussion, the Committee's request was withdrawn.
- On January 27, Alan met with Mark Friedman of the Edgartown School and Alex Dwyer and Shaun Hammond of Rise Engineering regarding more energy-efficient and better lighting for the school. Several options of upgrades to the lighting were discussed.
- Throughout the month, Jack, Alan, and Committee Member Kat Monterosso attended various meetings of the Edgartown Master Plan Committee.
- On January 31, Alan attended a meeting of the Selectboard and reviewed the Energy Reduction Plan for the Town's Green Community application. The Selectboard voted unanimously to approve the plan. At that meeting, the Selectboard also appointed seven town residents to the Climate Committee.

Library: Submitted by Lisa Sherman

The library is open for in-person services, which includes no-appointment browsing and services for both the main library and the Children's Room.

Current hours are: Mon, Thurs, Fri, Sat from 10am - 5pm and Tue/Wed 10am - 6pm. January foot traffic was 3,023.

<u>Of note</u>: In December 2021, the Edgartown Public Library received a three-star rating in a national ranking of *Library Journal's* annual review of public libraries.

Our library earned three out of five stars, and 14 other libraries in Massachusetts also received a starred rating. A total of 5,846 U.S. libraries were rated nationwide, and only 261 qualified as star libraries. Library Journal reviews public library data reported to the government including visits, checkouts, program attendance, e-material circulation, public computer use and WiFi sessions per capita, and ranks the best performing libraries within budget categories.

Shellfish: Submitted by Rob Morrison:

January 2022 saw license holders participating in a variety of fisheries during the month. The two primary fisheries were the commercial bay scallop fishery in Cape Pogue, and the commercial oyster fishery in Sengekontacket.

License holders participating in the commercial scallop fishery have their catch checked and recorded daily by department staff at North Wharf. The Sengekontacket oyster fishery was created by the Shellfish Department through their annual propagation effort. 500,000 oyster seed are grown by the department annually. These oysters are distributed throughout Sengekontacket to be harvested both recreationally and commercially. Commercial oyster catch is recorded in 100 count bags.

Recreational fishing for shellfish species including bay scallops, steamer clams, quahogs, and oysters took place in all Edgartown bodies of water open to fishing. Participation in recreational shell fishing is typically low in January due to weather conditions.
