The Matter of Balance classes sponsored by Healthy Aging MV were filled each week with people interested in learning ways to improve their balance and strength and to learn skills that will help them to avoid falls, which can be so impactful on their independence.

Energy Committee: Submitted by Alan Strahler

- On October 4, Committee Chair Alan Strahler met with Committee Members Ellen Price and Bonni Widdoes to work on an outreach plan to town residents regarding energy and cost savings measures residents might take. Dion Alley, Energy Transformation Coordinator at Vineyard Power, joined the group to discuss possible actions. Regarding electrification of home space and water heating, he advised that the pathway begins with an energy efficiency audit carried out through Cape Light Compact.
- Alan attended a meeting of the Cape Light Compact Board on October 12 as the Edgartown Board Member.
- On October 13, Alan joined the Edgartown Climate Committee meeting as the liaison to the Energy Committee.
- The Energy Committee met on October 20. Reports and discussions included (1) status of the Green Community Application and energy savings work; (2) improvements to the Committee's web page on the Town website; (3) tracking energy dispensed from EV chargers and renewable energy generated by the town's solar fields; (4) outreach plans for Town residents; (5) Muskeget Channel power cables from offshore wind, letter urging permitting; (6) status of the solar project on the Meshacket closed landfill; (7) and possible Town warrant articles and bylaws to propose and/or support at the April 2023 Town Meeting.
- Alan and Committee Member Jack Ensor met with Fire Chief Schaeffer on October 25, regarding a
 possible energy service facility, including solar power and battery storage, for the Fire and Police
 Departments on the Pease Point Way South campus.
- On October 26, Alan and other members of the Committee attended a meeting of the Conservation Commission to convey the Committee's support of the permit allowing the New England 1 Connector to be placed under the ocean floor in the Town's waters of Muskeget Channel.
- Energy Reports, October 2022:
 - Park and Ride Chargers: 646 kilowatt-hours of power dispensed, saving 113 kilograms of greenhouse gases; 18 sessions counted with 8 unique drivers
 - Katama Farm Solar Field: 102 megawatt-hours generated = annual energy for 3.2 average MA homes
 - Nunnepog Well Solar Field: 105 megawatt-hours generated = annual energy for 3.3 average MA homes

Shellfish: Submitted by Rob Morrison:

October 2022 saw license holders participating in a variety of fisheries during the month. With recreational scallop season beginning on October 1, scalloping saw the most participation from recreational license holders. Commercial scallop season began on October 31, 2022. The first day of commercial season saw approximately 30 limits taken from Cape Pogue.

Recreational fishing for shellfish species including steamer clams, quahogs, bay scallops and oysters took place in all Edgartown bodies of water open to fishing.

Wastewater Department: Submitted by William Burke:

Chief Operators Report, October, 2022

Flow for October 2022 was 5,843,807 gal. Total N was 1.64 mg/L and 1.39 mg/L for a monthly average of 1.52 mg/L reported to DEP. Septage for the month was 34,717 gallons.

Water Department: Submitted by William Chapman:

- Five water services were installed, with several more applications for service reviewed.
- Monthly bacteriological samples were collected and analyzed.
- Thirty Lead & Copper samples were collected from the distribution system, as well as two samples from each of the early education facilities. All samples were sent to the lab for analysis. The four lead tests for the schools were Non-Detect (0 ppm) and the four copper tests were well below the Action Level of 1.3 mg/L. The 90th percentile for the distribution system was well below the Action Levels for both lead and copper, with no samples exceeding either Action Level. Though fully compliant during our last round of samples, the results of this sampling event were much better, indicating continued improvements to our water chemistry alterations.
- The relocated water main at Stop & Shop was placed in service, having passed pressure and bacteriological testing. This project added two fire hydrants to the distribution system, as well as an additional loop to enhance fire flows and water quality.
- Water invoices went out for the October billing cycle.
- A tap was installed to replace / upgrade the water main on Mill Street prior to reconstruction of the road.
