The case management needs of our older adult community continue to grow, and we feel honored to be able to serve as a consistent, caring, and helpful organization to assist those in need. We regularly work with other island (and beyond) professionals and organizations that can provide the supports that individuals and families need.

Energy Committee: Submitted by Alan Strahler

- On January 10, Committee Chair Alan Strahler attended the Edgartown Climate Committee meeting as the liaison to the Energy Committee.
- Alan attended a meeting of the Cape Light Compact Board on January 11 as the Edgartown Board Member.
- On January 19, Alan attended a meeting of the Cape and Vineyard Electric Cooperative as the Edgartown representative.
- The Energy Committee met on January 19. Reports and discussions included: (1) an article for Town meeting to request funding for a strategic plan for all-electric municipal buildings with solar and batteries; (2) solar and battery storage for the planned new firehouse and renovated police station; (3) Edgartown School energy conservation measures and progress; (4) energy conservation measure for Wastewater Department pumps; (5) EV chargers at the Park and Ride lot; (6) production of Town solar fields; (7) outreach to Town residents on energy savings and home energy assessments; and (8) status of the Green Communities application, New England 1 Connector permit, and the Meshacket Landfill solar installation contract.
- On January 25, Committee members Jack Ensor and Alan met with Chief Alex Schaeffer to discuss resilience needs of Town infrastructure and progress on plans for the new Firehouse and renovation of the Police Headquarters on Pease's Point Way South.
- Also on January 25, members of the Committee attended a Conservation Commission public hearing regarding the requested permit for the power cables from the Park City Wind offshore wind project, referred to as the New England Wind 1 Connector, to pass underneath Muskeget Channel. The Committee urged permitting in prior written and oral testimony.
- Alan joined an ad-hoc committee meeting on January 27 at the Edgartown School regarding a Request for Qualifications for vendors to perform a strategic study for electric heating and cooling of the school.
- Energy Reports, January, 2023
 - o Katama Solar Field: 45.3 megawatt-hours generated = annual energy for 1.42 average MA homes
 - Nunnepog Well Solar Field: 42.9 megawatt-hours generated = annual energy for 1.35 average MA homes
 - o Park and Ride Chargers: 260.5 kilowatt-hours of power dispensed, saving 40.7 kilograms of greenhouse gases; 14 sessions counted with 12 unique drivers

Shellfish: Submitted by Rob Morrison:

January 2023 saw a continued strong harvest of bay scallops from Cape Pogue Bay. Although the bay scallop harvest was steady during the month of January, the wholesale price dropped after the NewYear. Sengekontacket Pond also saw one of the largest populations of adult bay scallops in several years. Several commercial limits of bay scallops were taken from Sengekontacket per week by dip net, during the third month of the commercial season.

Recreational fishing for shellfish species including steamer clams, quahogs, bay scallops, and oysters took place in all Edgartown bodies of water open to fishing.
