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and visitors have a new sense of appreciation for Diane's delicious meals with her last day of work approaching. We will miss her dearly.

The exceptionally rainy 2022-23 winter has, at times, wreaked havoc on our electrical and tech systems. On one terribly rainy day, we regretfully had to cancel a showing of our Thursday movie as a result of our failed technology. While our participants were disappointed, we learned valuable information: that a George Clooney movie will bring out a hearty crowd, even in the worst weather in the dead of winter. We will happily schedule more George Clooney based programming in the future.

The addition of Bill Glazier as a part-time outreach worker has been a wonderful addition to our staff. Bill has taken on some very complex case management work, including ones that involve veterans' benefits and challenging immigration hurdles. He has been a helpful and committed member of the Anchors team.

Energy Committee: Submitted by Alan Strahler

- On February 1, Committee Chair Alan Strahler attended a Town budget review and presented the Committee's request for \$43,500 from Free Cash from the FY2024 budget for a strategic plan for all-electric municipal buildings with solar and batteries.
- Alan attended a meeting of the Cape Light Compact Board on February 8 as the Edgartown Board Member.
- On February 9, Alan attended the Edgartown Climate Committee meeting as the liaison to the Energy Committee.
- On Monday, February 13, Alan attended a meeting of the MVC Eversource Working Group as the Edgartown representative, which discusses Island energy issues and future planning with Eversource.
- Alan met with a technician from ChargePoint at the Park and Ride lot on Wednesday, February 15, to correct a poor communication condition between the EV chargers and the local cellular data network.
- The Energy Committee met on February 16. Reports and discussions included: (1) the aforementioned article for Town Meeting to request funding for a strategic plan for all-electric municipal buildings with solar and batteries; (2) solar and battery storage for the planned new firehouse and renovated police station; (3) the Request for Qualifications for vendors to perform a strategic study for electric heating and cooling of the Edgartown School; (4) Edgartown School energy conservation measures and progress; (5) an energy conservation measure for Wastewater Department pumps; (6) Green Community Designation Grant budget; (7) EV chargers at the Park and Ride lot; (8) production of Town solar fields; (9) outreach to Town residents on energy savings and home energy assessments; (10) the meeting between Alan, Committee Member Jack Ensor, and Fire Chief Alex Schaeffer on resilience of Town infrastructure; and (10) status of the Green Communities application, New England 1 Connector permit, and the Meshacket Landfill solar installation contract. The Committee also spoke with a possible new Committee Member, Jack Connell, and voted unanimously to ask the Select board to appoint Mr. Connell to the Committee.

Shellfish: Submitted by Rob Morrison:

During the month of February 2023, fishermen experienced a continued strong harvest of bay scallops from Cape Pogue Bay. Although the bay scallop harvest was steady during the month of February, the wholesale price dropped after the New Year.

A commercial oyster season took place in Sengekontacket Pond during February. This oyster fishery is created by the Shellfish Department's oyster propagation program, now in its tenth year. Sengekontacket Pond also saw one of the largest populations of adult bay scallops in several years. Several commercial limits of bay scallops were taken from Sengekontacket per week by dip net, during the fourth month of the commercial season.

Recreational fishing for shellfish species including steamer clams, quahogs, bay scallops, and oysters took place in all Edgartown bodies of water open to fishing.

Zoning Board of Appeals: Submitted by Lisa Morrison:

- 35-2022 GOLDENEYE LLC (MALM) 24 KATAMA BAY VIEW ROAD (46-18.1) a request for a special permit under 10.1 G to install a swimming pool on a preexisting, nonconforming lot was denied.


