- On June 13, Alan and Committee Member Ellen Price attended a meeting of the Edgartown Climate Committee as liaisons from the Energy Committee.
- Alan attended a meeting of the Cape Light Compact Board as the Edgartown Board Member on June 14.
- On June 15, Alan attended a meeting of the Vineyard Sustainable Energy Committee as the Edgartown representative.
- The Energy Committee met on June 20 for its regular monthly meeting. Reports and discussions included: (1) report of Alan's meeting with Town Administrator Hagerty; (2) grant funding for strategic electrification plans and resilience of Town facilities; (3) possible new initiative on leaf blowers, string trimmers, etc.; (4) Energy Actions Report to Town and public; (5) status of Municipal Energy Technology Assistance grant; (6) Edgartown School energy conservation measures and electrification planning study; (7) META grant for energy study of firehouse and Police HQ; (8) status of EV chargers, Town solar fields, and report on outage history; (9) town solar fields report; (10) outreach to town residents on energy savings and home energy assessments; and (11) status of the contract for the solar project on the Meshacket Landfill.
- On June 26, Alan attended a meeting of the MVC Eversource Liaison Committee as the Edgartown representative.
- Town Administrator Hagerty submitted an application for the National Renewable Energy Laboratory Expert Match program on June 28 at the request of the Energy Committee. The application requested assistance in planning for solar panels and batteries for the Highway Department campus for energy savings and resilience.

 - Nunnepog Well Solar Field: 188.4 megawatt-hours generated = annual energy for 5.9 average MA homes
 - o Park and Ride Chargers: 974.3 kilowatt-hours of power dispensed, saving 409.7 kilograms of greenhouse gases; 62 sessions counted with 36 unique drivers
