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#### Shellfish: Submitted by Rob Morrison

During January 2024 the majority of the commercial bay scallop harvest was taken from Cape Pogue by means of dragging. There were also a handful of commercial and recreational bay scallop limits taken from Sengekontacket pond on a weekly basis.

Recreational fishing for shellfish species including steamer clams, quahogs, bay scallops, and oysters took place in all Edgartown bodies of water open to fishing.
